Drink this **impressive** 2011 Chardonnay over the next 3-4 years."

2011 Ram's Gate Winery Pinot Noir Ulises Valdez Diablo Vineyard

"The 2011 Pinot Noir Ulises Valdez Diablo Vineyard possesses a **DRC-like perfume** that takes one to the **grand crus of the Cote de Nuits**. The wine is broad, savory, medium to full-bodied, light on its feet, and **promising**. I would love to see what could be produced from this terroir and winemaker in a great vintage as this 2011 is **one heck-of-a wine** for such a challenging vintage. Drink it over the next 3-4 years."

2010 Ram's Gate Winery Syrah Parmelee-Hill Vineyard

"The black/purple-colored 2010 Syrah Parmelee-Hill Vineyard reveals a big, sweet perfume of bacon fat, lard, blackberries and bouquet garni. Medium to full- bodied, it has terrific acidity and a Northern Rhone style reminiscent of Hermitage more than St.-Joseph or Crozes-Hermitage. Notes of licorice, violets and spice as well as the wine's good acidity make for an impressive Syrah to drink over the next decade."
